Donald Scott Patterson, affectionately known as "Scotty P", 50, of Deatsville, AL passed away at a local hospital on Tuesday, May 19, 2020.

The son of Charles Donald and Betty Doris (Brown) Patterson, Scott was born November 4, 1969 in Birmingham, AL. A graduate of Stanhope Elmore High School and Trenholm State Technical College, Scott began his career as a paramedic in 1989. The following year he furthered his commitment to the community by joining the Montgomery Fire Department. He rose through the ranks and retired as a Captain after a 20-year career. He loved being a fire fighter, a medic, and the brotherhood it encompassed. When described by his peers, he was described as being cool, calm, and collected in the toughest of situations.

Scott had a larger than life personality, and never met a stranger. He had a huge heart that always had room for one more person. Playing golf and all things University of Alabama were his passions. Scott was always looking forward to the next adventure, and loved traveling with his wife, Laura. He was an admired and loved softball coach in the Montgomery East and Marbury softball leagues. His entire heart was behind everything he did, and you could not find a more loyal or passionate person. Throughout his life he wore many hats, and some of them all at the same time: loving husband, father, son, brother, uncle, friend, fire fighter, medic, safety officer, coach ...the list could go on and on.

Scott is survived by his loving wife Laura Patterson; his three daughters: Sloane Patterson, Haley Mitchell and Maggie Mitchell; his extra daughter in heart, Genevieve Filiatreau and her son Eli; sister, Jennifer Crevier; nephews Steven Crevier (Sherisa) & Chris Crevier; father & mother in law David & Lana Sherman; sister in law Karen Sellers; nieces Mattie & Gracie Sellers and Rebecca Crevier; his husband-in-law Rickey "Stump" Mitchell; and the brothers and sisters of the medic and fire department that he was proud to call family.
