Together, they made up a strong group of transcriptionists who, for years, carried the weight of an essential responsibility: transcribing reports that would determine life-changing diagnoses and treatments for families.

Tammy understood the magnitude of that work. Trusted by brilliant radiologists who depended on her precision, she worked hard to make sure reports were right, every single time. It may not sound like a glamorous job, but in reality, it was enormous. Families relied on those words, and Tammy never took that lightly. She was devoted, dependable, and deeply proud of her role.

She also made sure her coworkers—Jim, Jason, David, and even Jeff—kept things moving. She had a way of holding people accountable, while still making you laugh. She cared about the

details, about doing things right, and about being a team.

But more than anything, Tammy treasured her relationships. Her bond with her devoted friend Tara is something that can never be replaced. When you work so many hours every day with someone, you become a different kind of family. And when that family is broken, it leaves a space that's impossible to fill.

Tammy was hard-core. Hard-core in love, in friendship, in faith, and in work. And that is how she will always be remembered.
